VISION: Weaving Creativity into the Fabric of the Claremont Community

At WCCMA, we envision a community where the arts are deemed necessary to the vibrancy of our quality of life culturally, economically, socially, and educationally. It is with this vision in mind that we embark on a \$2MM capital campaign to build a new home for the arts in downtown Claremont while simultaneously building our programmatic and administrative capacity to better serve our community.



The West Claremont Center for Music and the Arts (WCCMA), with significant support from the City of Claremont and the Claremont Development Authority, is developing a multi-use space for the performance, exhibition, teaching, and creation of music, visual, and culinary arts in downtown Claremont. Located in the long-empty historic former Claremont National Bank Building at 56 Opera House Square, our new home is in a prime location at the heart of the City Center, adjacent to City Hall, offices, retail, and dining establishments and walkable from the homes of half the population. The venue will offer rehearsal and art studios, a state-of-the-art performance venue for WCCMA and resident artists, and new sources of earned revenue through rentals and ticket sales.

The capital project includes a complete renovation of the building, starting with the renovation of the envelope by the Claremont Development Authority, including new plumbing, electrical, and HVAC; and followed by the fit-up by WCCMA. The finished building will be an active center for education and performances, as well as a place for community gathering. The entire project is estimated to cost \$2MM and includes operational reserve funds to allow WCCMA to add staff and programming necessary to best serve our community, incubate artists' work, and grow our audience. Currently the project has major support from NH Community Development

Finance Authority (CDFA) CDBG grant (\$500,000) and additional funding from the Our Kids Commission of the NH Episcopal Diocese, US Department of Agriculture's Rural Development and Business Grant, The Jack and Dorothy Byrne Foundation, Capital Regional Development Council, Weller and Michal Architects, Mascoma Bank, and private donors. We have also attained \$400,000 in New Hampshire's Community Development Finance Authority tax credit funds; we are now actively seeking business partners to purchase these credits for Fiscal Year 2020 and 2021 to help make this dream of an art center for Claremont a reality.

WCCMA CORE PROGRAMS

Professional Concert Series (since 2008): Year-round performances by touring artists from near and far, including at WCCMA's flagship Summer and Fall Concert Series at Union Church. Artists are inspiring and award winning performers and composers in all genres of music. Admission is by donation so that everyone in our community can explore new or familiar emerging and established artists.

Youth Arts Enrichment Initiative (since 2012): Arts workshops, music lessons, and services to the youth in our community, including matching underserved students with instruments they can borrow for free, and scholarships for lessons and workshops. It also provides student recitals, community ensemble opportunities, and small ensembles for students studying music, a key to developing as a musician and as a person.
